
Book Guide

Questions

- Look around. What colors do you see? I see your ______ shirt and your _____ pants. (Name the colors of their clothes.)
- What colors do you think Bear will see in this book?

Activities

As you read the book, see if you can find something in your home that matches the color on each page.

<u>Color Hunt:</u>

Using a small lunch bag or paper grocery sack, put a piece of colored paper on the outside. Have your child see how many things they can find to put in the bag that match that color. (You can use more than one bag with different colors or change out the color on the bag after you've talked about all the things your child found that are the "special color.")

I Spy!

As you're taking a walk or settling in for a nap, or even waiting in the doctor's office, play *I Spy!* You start. "I spy with my little eye something green." Have your child look around and see if they can find something green. When he's figured it out, have him try and you guess his colored item. (You can also do this with other words like "rough" or "hard" or "sticky." It's a great way to learn new words and their meanings!)
