Small Group Engagement

This resource will supply instructors with strategies to help support collaborative learning and feedback in their learners. These two skills can have significant impact for adult learners as best described in this quote: "Through concepts of cooperative learning, adults can enhance their knowledge and skills in a shorter time than while working individually. By sharing their workload and disseminating information more quickly, adult learners may realize their goals more readily and thoroughly" (Johnson, et al. 1991). These skills can transfer from the classroom to authentic situations/scenarios for adult learners and help them synthesize their learning.

Learners will be working in groups to demonstrate their learning. The following activities are meant to provide collaborative learning opportunities for learners that will also help them synthesize their learning, reflect on their learning, and make connections to their learning, as well as their own lives. The activities will also foster teamwork and speaking and listening skills. Consider using <u>this template</u> to guide your work with your learners. You may consider re-wording the questions on page four of the guide for your learners to help them with their presentation skills while using the following options.
