ADULT LITERACY IS AN INTERSECTIONAL ISSUE THAT IS LINKED TO HIGHER EARNINGS IN THE LABOR MARKET, BETTER HEALTH, AND HIGHER LEVELS OF CIVIC ENGAGEMENT. ACCORDING TO A GALLUP STUDY COMMISSIONED BY THE BARBARA BUSH FOUNDATION, THE U.S. COULD BE LOSING \$2.2 TRILLION -- OR 10% OF GDP -- ANNUALLY DUE TO LOW ADULT LITERACY RATES. INVESTING IN ADULT LITERACY IS ABSOLUTELY CRITICAL TO DISRUPT THE MULTIGENERATIONAL CYCLES OF POVERTY AND ITS IMPACTS.
